(3) John Homsher died 13 September 1938. Frederick

Homsher elected 8 November 1938 to fill vacancy.

(4) P. J. Henney, who was also Allegheny County Coroner, was forced to resign his seat by a Pa. Supreme Court ruling. James Fulton was elected 7 November 1939 to fill the vacancy.
