*** John Bishop declined his seat on 31 October 1783 and was replaced by Valentine Eckert on 16 January 1784.

**** Sharp Delany was replaced by Charles Pettit on 30 July 1784.

***** Joseph Savitz appears to be the same as Joseph Savage, who served in the 4th, 5th, and 7th sessions of the Assembly.

@ During the 3rd session, John Steinmetz, Moses McClellan, and Charles Pettit began voting with the Radical (Constitutionalist) faction of the Assembly, apparently because of the proposed revisions of the Test Act.
