

# U. S. Senate Election

28 February 1793

**Albert Gallatin (Fayette) = 45; Henry Miller (Lancaster) = 35; Arthur St. Clair = 1;  
Gen. William Irwine = 1; Not voting = 5**

Gallatin took the oath of office on 2 December 1793, but a petition filed on the same day alleged that Gallatin was not a U. S. citizen. On 28 February 1794, the Senate determined that Gallatin was, in fact, not a citizen under the existing laws and declared the election void. The seat was finally filled through another election held on 31 March 1794.
